

Hope!

Saying goodbye to 2020, we hope for a much better 2021. As I write, however, new cases of COVID-19 are on the rise, people are rioting in major cities, and governments are further shutting down schools, businesses, houses of worship, and even (in California) family dinners. Through it all, our rallying cry continues to be "Focus on Jesus and follow His plan."

Why focus on Jesus? Because He is our Lord and our God (John 20:28). He is our Creator (1:3), our Savior (Philippians 3:20), our King (Colossians 1:13). Why follow His plan? Quite simply, because of who Jesus is. Our obedience is due Him. Any plan other than His is doomed to failure and a waste of our lives.

One of the messages I've been preaching this year is titled "Jesus, Our Hope." It is centered in the gospel about Jesus, and recently, I've divided significant components of this good news into two sections: The Heart of the Gospel and The Hope of the Gospel.

The Heart of the Gospel consists of 1) An Event: Jesus died; 2) An Achievement: By His death in our place for our sins, Jesus achieved the possibility of our forgiveness and salvation; 3) An Offer: Those who repent of their sins and receive Jesus by faith as their Savior and Lord are offered forgiveness and salvation; and 4) An Application: Those who do repent of their sins and receive Jesus by faith as their Savior and Lord are forgiven and saved.

The Hope of the Gospel is that everything Jesus did is part of God's purpose and plan. God has had the restoration and reconciliation of His fallen creation as His purpose and plan since before the foundation of the world. And God is sovereign! God is all-powerful! Anything that God purposes and plans will be accomplished. If that isn't reason for certain hope, nothing is.

The year 2020 has been tough; 2021 may be tough too. But God is in control. I like Corrie ten Boom's observation: "God has no problems, only plans." Focus on Jesus and follow His plan!

It is my great pleasure to once again extend this Call to Convention to each member and friend of the General Conference of the Church of God (Seventh Day). After 2020, aren't we all ready for the in-person fellowship and worship our conventions allow us to enjoy? Plan now to attend!

Our 2021 Biennial Convention is scheduled for Monday evening, July 5, through Saturday night, July 10, in Covington, Kentucky. Most convention events will take place at the Northern Kentucky Convention Center. Three beautiful, newly remodeled hotels are available to attendees. Marriott and Embassy Suites hotels are just across the street from the convention center, and Holiday Inn (a kid-friendly option) is within walking distance.

Six major worship services are planned! They will include wonderful music, fervent prayer, encouraging personal testimonies, challenging sermons, and more – all focused on our 2021 convention theme "Faithful." Scheduled speakers are Elders Loren Gjesdal, Kenneth Lawson, Ruben Beard, Samuel Holland, and Loren Stacy.

As many seminars or workshops will be offered as meeting space allows (English or Spanish). Additional programs and activities will be available for most every age group: children, teens, young adults, and seniors. General Conference business sessions will be conducted Tuesday through Friday mornings. In these, members will receive up-to-date reports of the State of the Conference, the General Conference Ministries, and the General Conference finances. Qualified voters will elect members to our board of directors and to our Nominating Committee, and can debate and decide any bylaw amendments or resolutions that may be proposed.

Covington, Kentucky, provides many great opportunities for individual or group outings. The worldfamous Ark Encounter is less than an hour away; a Monday group outing is planned there for all who wish to come a day early. The Creation Museum is even closer! The National Underground Railroad Freedom Center and a beautiful riverfront park are just across the Ohio River, and a wonderful aquarium is nearby.




General Conference Ministries

Total Receipts and Total Expenses

Artios Christian College, Missions, and Publications (Bible Advocate Press) are the current GC Ministries. They receive financial support from direct offerings and from a portion of the 15 percent of members' tithes received by the General Conference. Expenditures are guided by each ministry's annual budget. In addition, the General Conference manages the receipt and disbursement of your gifts to a variety of additional ministries, such as Orphans and Widows, SHINE, Cristo Viene, and Disaster Relief.



Your Gifts to Each Ministry



Total Receipts and Total Expenses

The General Conference administration (president, executive director, IT, finance, office management, and other staff not connected to a GC Ministry or district) receives financial support from 15 percent of members' tithes (minus what is then allocated to the GC Ministries) and direct offerings. Expenditures are guided by an annual budget.
