### The Strongest Link

Welcome to the February-March Churchright. Much will happen over the next two months. Conference Tour resumes full throttle. Board of Directors and License and Credentials Committee meet. Annual Prayer Initiative, Lord's Supper, and SHINE's Haiti mission happen back to back. Convention planning and promotion are in full momentum.

Through these we see the presence of Conference leaders in the field, Conference business conducted while members aren't in session, documenting men called to ministry, corporate prayer, communion of saints, sharing hope abroad, and preparation for convention.

And there's more. District and ministries events, including NAWM's Ladies Day and spring quarter curriculum for all ages. Publications' Heidelberg press keeps turning. Tracks and other free literature are printed and distributed globally; hymnbooks are shipped; the BA is edited, proofed, and translated. Inquiries (doctrinal, personal, salvation, etc.) come by phone, fax, e-mail, and website. The phone rings. Membership applications are processed. There are accounting services, foreign missions wire transfers, administration of employee benefits, committee meetings, and lots more.

My point? There's a lot going on, there are costs involved, and you're privileged to partner with others in support of our joint efforts as a General Conference — doing together what no one member or congregation can do alone.

Our bylaws allow congregations to "manage their own financial affairs locally," remitting a portion (of the tithe) to fund district and Conference operations. Additionally, emphasis offerings for causes deemed worthy of your support are given. Failure to support your local church financially, or failure of your local church treasurer to remit funds to the district, creates shortfalls at the Conference level.

Do you support your local church financially? Does your local treasurer regularly and punctually remit funds as designated? Don't know? You should ask. The answer is important to our joint efforts.

In essence, the currency of your donation can be transformed into hope and life for many (locally, nationally, and globally) if all the links in our partnership chain are strong. So let us examine our link and commit to being a strong one — in fact, the strongest — as we take the gospel to the ends of the earth!

### CALL TO CONVENTION



This is my official invitation to all members (and friends) of the General Conference to attend the 2013 Biennial Convention, July 1-6, at the Hilton Hotel and CenturyLink Center, Omaha, Nebraska.

I look forward to issuing this invitation (call to convention) every two years because of the images conventions evoke: gathering of old friends (it seems like an unending

family reunion), exciting fellowship, rich worship featuring some of our best preachers and teachers, general sessions, Bible studies, meal functions, ministry highlights, business sessions, and more. The Biennial Convention has been called "a cherished tradition," and it truly is.

This time we'll meet in Omaha, not one of our nation's most popular cities but one on the rise in twenty-first century business enterprises. Omaha has a combined big city-small town feel and is great for family-friendly (and frugal) travel. There's a lot to see and do there: museums, the Omaha zoo (recently named by TripAdvisor as the number one zoo in the US and Omaha's biggest attraction, which features America's largest aquarium in a zoo), and nearby Boys Town. ### 2013 Amendments Committee


The Amendments Committee (John Schott, chairman; Ken Knoll; and Tim Steinhauser) stands ready to receive any proposed amendments to our General Conference bylaws that our members may wish to propose for consid-

eration during our 2013 General Conference Convention business sessions. Per our current bylaws, proposed amendments must be submitted to the Amendments Committee "at least 120 days before the convention." This year, that deadline is **March 3**. Proposed amendments must be submitted with the recommendation of one or more of the following: a district board, a state conference, the board of directors, the North American Ministerial Council, the Amendments Committee, and/or a petition of 50 members of the Conference. The Amendments Committee will distribute proposals to the membership at least 30 days before the beginning of our 2013 convention, scheduled July 1-6, in Omaha, Nebraska.

### Board of Directors Promise

Following our 2011 convention, during which a board of directors project that may have led to a proposal to combine all General Conference governing documents into one "constitution" received much discussion, the board announced that it planned to return to that project that had been put on hold since early 2010. However, late last summer before any further work was done by the board's committee, the board received a request from the License and Credentials Committee of the North American Ministerial Council to leave that project on hold a while longer in the interest of peace and unity within our church. The board immediately agreed that it would not initiate any discussion of the project during the 2012 meetings of the North American Ministerial Council or the 2013 General Conference Convention. No further work has been done, and none is scheduled.






