

Back to Nehemiah

As much as I desire to be a godly leader, I often struggle. One thing that calls me back to the right path is studying the examples of godly leadership in the Bible, like Nehemiah.

There are many principles I could draw from this book, but I list seven here.



Do I care this deeply about the problems I see? Too often I am not bothered by them but am actually a part of them. Let's pray that God's concerns become our concerns.

- **2.** A godly leader is humble before God and his brothers (v. 6). He engages in honest self-examination. Often we need to begin with confession of sin and wrong and include personal, organizational, or cultural failures or as in Nehemiah's case, a combination of the two. A godly leader is humble enough to admit these.
- 3. A godly leader is not self-serving and determines to honor God above all else (v. 11a). Nehemiah understood that God hears and answers those who sincerely desire to honor Him alone. A godly leader is not agenda-driven but driven by God's agenda. Let's make sure we are adopting God's view and vision of ministry.
- 4. A godly leader prepares for leadership by being faithful (v. 11b; 2:5). What kind of cupbearer do you suppose Nehemiah was? Lazy and unreliable? Do we conduct ourselves in such a way that when we are called on to lead, we have actually earned the capital to do it?
- **5.** A godly leader is bothered enough by the current state of affairs that he develops a plan or a vision (2:5). Nehemiah didn't remain in a state of perpetual mourning. He developed a plan and pursued it passionately. A godly leader sees the current circumstance and envisions something better. Nehemiah envisioned a much-improved condition for Jerusalem.

6. A godly leader mobilizes others to action [vv. 17, 18]. Nehemiah could not have rebuilt the walls by himself. He enlisted the help of his brothers so that even with the opposition they faced, they completed the task in only fifty-one days. A godly leader clearly communicates the plan and transfers his passion so that others can help with the work.

7. As a godly leader pursues the vision, he will face opposition (v. 7). Before the work was even started, Nehemiah anticipated resistance to his plan. The people had to work with a trowel in one hand and a sword in the other. This way, they could deal with the opposition and still complete the Lord's work.

What can we learn from this? First, even while dealing with opposition, we must focus on fulfilling God's vision for us. We can't allow resistance to derail us. Recent events have reduced our effectiveness in wall building. We must ensure that we are engaging in the work the Lord has called us to.

Second, we often lose sight of who the opposition is and instead turn our swords on each other. This keeps us from completing God's work and leaves us wounded so that we can never be as effective in His work as we would have been otherwise. Let's remember who the opposition is: Satan, the enemy of our souls — the one whose purpose is to steal, kill, and destroy. As much as it depends on us, we need to make sure that we unite as brothers against our common enemy.

Board Update

The General Conference board of

directors held its annual winter meeting in Denver, Colorado, February 17-20. The 2011- 2013 board consists of Mark Caswell, Erik Dunn, Jose Hernandez, Chip Hinds, Samuel Holland, Wayne Hrenyk, Ruben Marquez, Raul Romo, Loren Stacy, John Tivald, and Larry Zaragoza. (Elder Carl Palmer resigned this past October because of health concerns.) All the current members were present except for Erik Dunn, who was unable to receive leave from his employment. General Conference President Whaid Rose was also present for most of the sessions.

During its meeting, the board received and responded to reports from the president and others regarding the state of the General Conference, as well as its ongoing ministries, projects, and concerns, and it adopted the 2013/2014 budget. The board was challenged by reports of the effects our nation's new health care law will force upon our church as an employer, and it was encouraged by a presentation of short-term and long-term goals by President Rose — so encouraged that it adopted a formal resolution endorsing the direction that our president is leading us.

Other highlights of the board meeting included a Human Resources training session conducted by Gary Hansen, former HR director for Promise Keepers; a detailed financial presentation by accountant Dawn Wayman; and a lunch with staff at our General Conference offices.

Significant board actions of this meeting include the preparation of a motion to amend the General Conference bylaws as instructed by a resolution adopted by the members present during the 2011 convention; the endorsement of making SHINE an officially sponsored entity of our Missions Ministries; the appointment of Leeroy Williams as superintendent of the Eastern Canadian District for the remainder of the current term (Samuel Holland tendered his resignation effective February 15); and the appointment of Calvin Burrell as director of our Missions Ministries and Santiago Chavez as assistant director, April 1, 2013 through the remainder of the current term, which ends June 30, 2014.




