Defining Worship

Previously on this page I suggested that because a day is coming when all of human history will narrow down to the ceaseless worship of the Lamb of Glory, our most important question should therefore be "How, then, shall we worship?"

Answering this question should begin with a biblical definition of *wor-ship*. Determining how we must worship should begin with understanding what worship is in the first place.

Much is said in Scripture about this subject, but nothing in terms of a concise dictionary-type definition. Nonetheless, drawing upon the many things Scripture does say about worship, we can develop a working definition against which all elements of our worship can be evaluated.

Rather than parsing the Hebrew and Greek words translated "worship" in Scripture (that will come later), let's consider some of the common definitions crafted by various spiritual leaders and authors* who've delved deeply into the Bible to discover *worship*'s true meaning. Remember, this isn't something new; we need not reinvent the wheel.

Worship is the believer's affirmative response to God's self-revelation, the active response of a community of believers to the glory of God, attributing praise and honor for who He is and what He has done.

Worship is communion and intimacy with God, the act of joyously loving and celebrating God — the highest and most fulfilling activity in which believers can engage.

Worship is the believer's heart response to God's character, attributes, and truth in His Word.

Worship is focusing the mind's attention and the heart's affection on the love, grace, and mercy of God, which daily informs and guides our actions and experiences.

Worship is a lifestyle.

Defining *worship* isn't easy; it is a big and multi-faceted subject. But we must work at it, for everything we do in worship flows out of our definition. So prayerfully ponder its meaning as we strive to truly become a worshipping church.


Reality Check



We experienced this first-hand during the recent convention in Nigeria. Worship Nigerian style involves all of the "in between": ceremony, pageantry, boundless energy, and a festival of choirs rendering selections that range from contemporary to traditional high-church anthems. It reflects the evolution of worship in CoG7 at home and abroad. To God be the glory!





Africa

Accompanied by IMC Representative Robert Crawford of the UK, Calvin Burrell and Bryan Cleeton of G. C. Missions worked in Zone 5 for two weeks in December 2013.

Ghana. In the cities of Accra, Kumasi, and Offinso we met for five days with national conference leaders, visited a church construction site, preached and taught at a large Sabbath gathering, and met with a pastors-leaders group to work for unity among CoG7 groups in Ghana.

Nigeria. In the town of Omoku (near Port Harcourt) we attended a five-day convention for delegates and leaders from thirteen African nations where the Church exists. Fifty-plus visitors from Africa and elsewhere joined many more Nigerian members and families to make large crowds (up to 6,000 on Sabbath) for a program that featured a Festival of Choirs — dozens

of them — from the host country. Preaching and teaching were strong, and 120 persons were baptized the last day!

We believe the momentum seen and gained in Nigeria will result in increased gospel effort and fruit across the entire continent. African nations where CoG7 is currently represented through IMC or G. C. Missions efforts: Burundi, Cameroon, D.R. Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, South Africa, South

Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

Our special thanks to Pastor Robert Crawford and the entire Nigerian church for their love and hard work to plan and provide for this Pan-African convention!

Sierra Leone. Following convention, Bryan Cleeton met with Peter Blackie and his leadership team for an additional two weeks. In this 60+ percent Muslim nation, they reviewed the extensive Orphan and Widow work taking place and discussed development of agriculture and other means to sustain long-term ministry. Locations visited included Freetown, Makeni, Segbwema, and Rokupr. Over three Sabbaths, 175 new converts were baptized, committing their lives to Christ!

They also participated in a roundtable discussion to share ideals, struggles, and plans to use their professional training to benefit God's church.



Pioneer Missionary Training

This year's PMT1 trip, held in Villahermosa, Tabasco, December 19-29, 2013, was amazing! God's presence was felt every step of the way. We encountered several obstacles, but we overcame them.

Only a few of us were bilingual, but God gave us the words and stamina to provide adequate translation. Despite the language barrier, great relationships were formed. Thankfully, heavy rainfall and flooding in some areas didn't last long and didn't cause serious harm.

Our training focused on evangelism, worship, service, discipleship, and fellowship. Many of us had to cast our fears aside and jump headfirst into assigned tasks, such as door-to-door ministry, family groups, and public evangelism. These fears were quickly forgotten once we witnessed the great needs of the people we encountered.

We were all blown away by the kindness, patience, and generosity of the Villahermosa brethren throughout our stay. We experienced the same kindness and openness from the majority people we met along the way. All of us were reminded that even if things didn't go as planned, God was always in control. In the end, He led us down the best path!


