Transforming Vision into Reality

What is Our Target?

Can you imagine playing a game of basketball without any hoops? A game of football without any goal lines? Can you imagine a footrace without a finish line or an archery competition without any targets?

Specific targets (goals) are critical in most every area of our lives. Without them, we can't know where we're going or whether we've arrived.

Unfortunately, many people live and work without clear goals. Frustrated with his colleagues, someone famously bemoaned, "We aim at nothing and hit it every time."

Thankfully, Jesus didn't leave us without a clear, specific target for our efforts on His behalf. Just before ascending back to heaven, He gave us our mission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you . . ." (Matthew 28:19, 20, NASB).

The Greek text of this passage contains several participial phrases (*go-ing, baptizing, teaching*), but only one imperative mission: Make disciples! We may be active for our Lord and church, but if the result isn't more fully committed disciples of Jesus Christ, we fail to fulfill our mission. We may become focused on the tools and techniques of "doing church" and how to better fulfill our mission, but if this focus doesn't result in completely committed disciples of Jesus Christ, we fail. Our goal, our target, our very purpose is "Make disciples!"

The vision of a vibrant 21st century church that God has given us is a vision of vibrant 21st century believers practicing love and reproducing our full commitment to Christ in others, as God enables us. The ten points of our vision provide a checklist for attaining our goal: Christ Centered, Spirit Formed, Bible Based, Sabbath Celebrating, Distinct Yet Inclusive, Passionate in Worship, Compassionate in Service, Engaging in Witness, United in Fellowship, Committed to Discipleship.

That's our target. God grant that we hit it every time.


the stories in 2 Samuel and 1 and 2 Kings — from David bringing the ark to Jerusalem to Elisha healing Naaman of leprosy. Students will witness what happens when people obey God, then disobey Him. Most important, students will learn that God loves and provides for us and is eager to forgive us when we've sinned.
